Two incredible men were born in the month of January and stood together to ensure that the concepts of peace and understanding in our world were heard. 



Tu BiSh'yat

Tu BiSh'vat or the "New Year of the Trees" is Jewish Arbor Day. The holiday is observed on the 15th (*tu*) of the Hebrew month of Sh'vat. Scholars believe that originally Tu BiSh'vat was an agricultural festival, marking the emergence of spring. In the 17th century, Kabbalists created a ritual for Tu BiSh'vat that is similar to a Passover seder. Today, many Jews hold a modern version of the Tu BiSh'vat seder each year.

Modern-day Jews celebrate <u>Tu BiSh'vat</u> by expressing joy and thankfulness for trees, harvests, and the natural world. Many Jews plant trees at home and in Israel, and eat delicious fruits and greens in celebration of this "New Year of the Trees." During this agricultural festival, Jews around the world consider our obligation to care for the environment and our sacred responsibility to share the fruits of God's earth with all.


